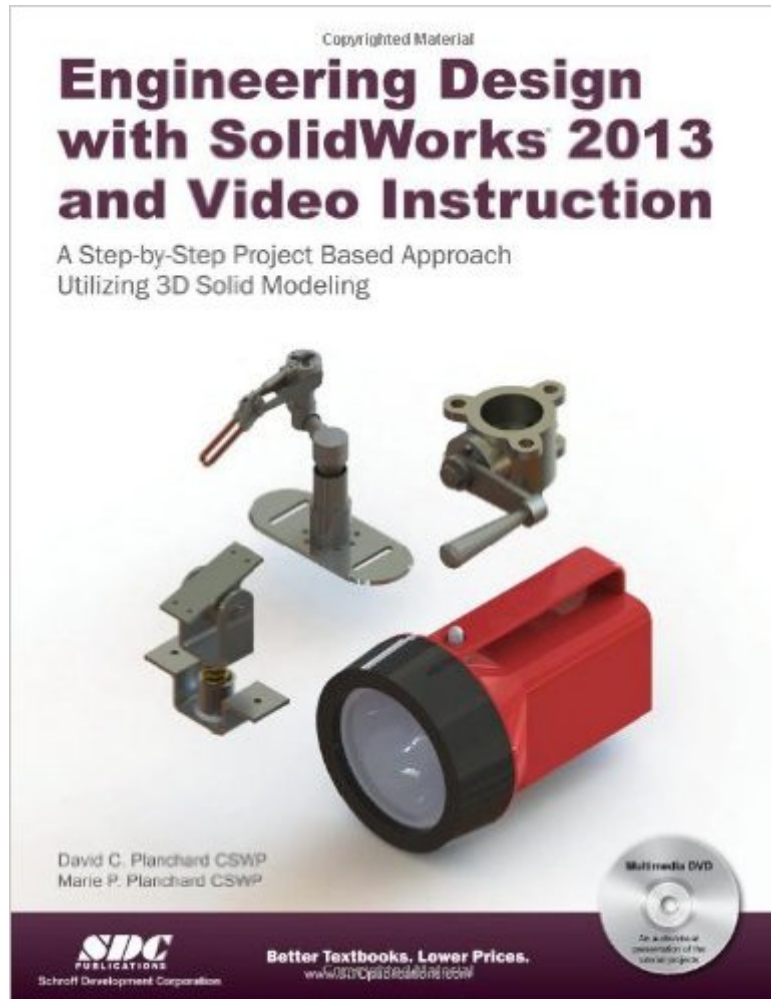

On-line intelligent catalogs guide designers to the product that meets both their geometric requirements and performance functionality.
